The play starts with a minor case of mistaken identity. It's 1970 and Lee has grown frustrated with her dull suburban life. She leaves her husband (much to his surprise) and rents the first apartment she can find in the city, sharing with two girls (Pat and Tracy). Tracy is a young psychology student who has also started to rent the apartment with two guys (Lee and Pat). Pat is already in situ and spends ,much of the play dressed as one of her characters (as an aspiring actress).

As they come to terms with sharing one bed and one sofa, no bathroom and a bathtub under the counter, Lee's husband, Bob, arrives to take her back home. She refuses and the play unfolds as Pat chases Tracy but via a hilarious drunken dalliance with Bob and Lee explores her new freedom with Tracy. This is a fun play, with four good characters for young people and lots of witty lines between all the characters in that snappy, sassy dialogue you expect from American comedies from this period. Think Neil Simon's Odd Couple or Barefoot in the Park and you'll get the idea. Better still grab a script and read it for yourself!

**Period:** New York, late 60s or early 70s

**Set:** A single room crummy apartment in Greenwich Village.

**Costumes**: period – plus various outlandish costumes for Pat, including Shirley Temple costume

Props: Various personal Sound: Nothing too outlandish
